CCC ROP will share the action plan during ROP meetings and professional learning days. Over the six years, we will continue to collect and analyze data on our program and address opportunities for continued growth.

Freedom HS ROP Teacher shares best practices at CTA conference

Freedom HS Careers with Children teacher, Stephanie Marple, presented two workshops at the 2023 Good Teaching Conference in Burlingame. Sponsored by the California Teachers Association, the conference highlighted excellent teaching and learning practices. Ms. Marple presented, "Incorporating Work-



Based Learning into the CTE Classroom" and "Using Dungeons & Dragons to Create Engaging Lessons and Increase Curriculum Retention." Ms. Marple shared that "Tabletop role-playing games (TTRPGs) are one way teachers can bring their curriculum to life in a way that is relevant, engaging, entertaining, and immersive." Ms. Marple will be reprising these two workshops in March at the <u>CTA Good Teaching</u> <u>Conference - South</u>.

Future Business Leaders of America is a thriving CTSO that provides business students with both academic and professional experience in the workplace. Through FBLA, students have the opportunity to compete in a variety of Business topics and gain knowledge in the field. Under the direction of ROP Business teacher, Andrew Cardiasmenos, Dougherty Valley High School's FBLA Chapter is growing at a rapid rate! The travel team just returned from Bay Section Leadership Conference and secured many high placements in various events, with a large portion of the team advancing to the State level. In addition, the school won 5th place overall in the Bay Area.



Applications open for 2023-2024 CCCOE Code.org Professional Learning Cohort

According to the <u>2021 State of Computer Science Education: Accelerating Action Through Legacy Report</u>, 50% of High Schools in Contra Costa County offer a foundational course in Computer Science.

California has on almost 76,000 computing jobs open each month, yet in 2018 there were only 7,311 CS graduates from California universities. CCCOE, in partnership with Code.org, offers a yearlong professional learning program for Middle and High School teachers to learn how to teach CS with Code.org's free curriculum.

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Teachers can apply at <u>code.org/apply</u>. The cost for CCC teachers is \$1000 (a \$1500 savings) and full scholarships are available.

CCC ROP Teachers Collaborate Across Sites & Districts

CCC ROP Coordinators arranged for ROP teachers to collaborate with peers across sites and districts. In January, California High School and San Ramon Valley High School Careers in Teaching instructors spent a day collaborating on curriculum and aligning programs. Shanin McKavish and Cindi Sekera shared ideas and activities that will engage their CIT students with richer learning opportunities. "It was an incredible opportunity to discuss the curriculum for such a valuable program," said Sekera.

A few weeks later, CCCOE hosted Sports Medicine teachers from across the county for an all-day collaborative advisory. Six teachers attended this full day meeting:

Sarah Tolvtar explained that these days are so important to ensuring that schools are offering high quality programs. "I absolutely love this time to get together with other teachers to do this type of collaboration. So often we are the only ones teaching our subject at our schools, so we have to rely upon each other and our own personal exploration to have growth of our teaching practices. "

During this time, the teachers were able to share some great lessons, create a shared google drive for materials, collaborate on future learning opportunities for students, and walk through curriculum to create some consistency among our programs. Teacher Fellowships Applications Now Open for Summer 2023

Get Paid to complete Hands-on Summer PD!

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Full-time K-16 teachers can now apply for Ignited's 2023 Summer Fellowship Program. Selected Fellows complete industry and research projects at companies and university labs, like Amazon Lab126 and Stanford Universities. Teachers work full-time for 7 or 8 weeks and are paid up to \$9,000 for completing an 8-week project with the Summer Fellowship Program.

Projects range in industry and subject, with the majority of in the STEM fields (science, tech, engineering, and math). Participants gain first-hand experiences in the applications of the subjects and skills they teach and are supported in infusing curriculum with "real world" connections that further engage students. Participants can also choose to earn 32 CEUs and/or apply for Ignited's Fund for Innovation, a competitive \$1,000 grant that supports new and exciting classroom ideas that improve teacher instruction and student achievement. These projects begin to be filled in March, so it's best to apply ASAP. For more info, review the eligibility criteria and requirements, frequently asked questions, and application process.

Cal High Careers in Teaching Students Learning Through Hands On Activities by CCC ROP Teacher, Shanin McKavish

Students in the Careers in Teaching (CIT) course at California High are learning about the field of education through a variety of hands-on activities and experiences while earning college credit. The 28 students in the class participate in seminar sessions 1-2 days a week where they learn about classroom management, history of education, student learning styles, California teaching standards and depth of knowledge.



Through their experience in their seminar sessions and internship, CIT students are building a foundation of skills and knowledge to not only help them in the field of education but in any career field. They are learning responsibility, time management, critical thinking, leadership, professionalism, collaboration, communication and much much more.



In their seminar session students have the opportunity to be hands on with the curriculum through a variety of activities. During the fall semester students worked collaboratively to write a word while sharing 1 pen, they used STEAM curriculum to create bouncy balls and experienced sensory exploration with shaving cream and goop.

The students are spread among 7 different schools interning in classrooms ranging from TK to 8th grade. One to two days a week students are working in their internship classroom with their mentor teacher and students. While at their internship CIT students lead small groups activities, work one on one with students, read to the class and a variety of other activities.



CVCHS Civil Engineering students celebrate CTE Month

Clayton Valley CHS Civil Engineering and Architecture Juniors visited the Lennar Homes Residential job site to learn about the various professions in Civil Engineering, Architecture, Land Development, and Building Industries. Led by teacher Joanna Castillo, they learned about the construction process from start to finish including; plumbing, solar, HVAC, structure and manufacturing,



electrical, foundation, framing, and home design. The students toured the property in various stages of construction and interacted with all the professionals on site who

Precision Exams offer students entry- to mid-level certifications that act as tangible proof of their skills and knowledge. Proof that helps them enter the workforce or skip entry-level college courses, gain preferred hiring status, or earn a wage increase.
