DVC Hosts Educator Conference

On March 17, Diablo Valley College's Early Childhood Education Department hosted a High School Education Conference. Approximately 100 students from local high schools attended to connect their learning in Education Pathway courses with future education and careers.

The day included workshops by DVC faculty and a keynote by Dr. Francis Pearman.



As Assistant Professor at Stanford Graduate School of Education, Dr. Pearman spoke of the opportunities that educators have to shape children's lives. Dr. Pearman shared his life journey as a student and an educator and connected it to the various educational careers from teacher to superintendent. His research explores the impact of poverty and inequality on educational opportunity, sharing with the students the integral role they can have in education to build a bright world for our country.





FAA Launches Student Design Challenge

The Federal Aviation Administration's has launched the 2023 Airport Design Challenge as part of its ongoing efforts to engage with students about careers in aviation.



The challenge helps students design virtual airports using the Microsoft game Minecraft. Students grades K-12, both in the United States and elsewhere, are eligible to participate. The students, many of whom are studying science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM), will meet aviation professionals and learn about the aerospace industry and STEM concepts and careers.

Contra Costa Adult School Students Earn College Credit With CTE Computer Course



Contra Cost Adult School's Computer ROP classes provide students with valuable career and technical education that allows them to enter the workforce with skills and competencies to be successful, pursue advanced training in postsecondary educational institutions, or upgrade existing skills and knowledge. The class provides rigorous and high-quality training that prepares students for post-secondary education and strengthens employability skills. CCAS has

an articulation agreement with Los Medanos Collage, which supports post-secondary transition. The CCAS course curriculum is aligned with the CCCOE benchmark objectives. Students receive certificates for demonstrating competency in Windows Operation Systems, MS Word, PowerPoint, and Excel. Forty-six students have been enrolled in the program so far this 2022-2023 school year, with 19 students reaching one or more course objectives.


Antioch Educator Recognized As Educator Of The Year At JA Business Hall Of Fame Event

CHEVRON ROP PROGRAM STARTS AUGUST 16!

Registration is open from July 25 to August 5 for the Fall 2022 CCC ROP's Process Plant Operator class. The 18- week program runs from August 16 through December 15. This course will help students prepare for an entry level operator job in the petrochemical and related industries.

Curriculum includes:

- Iob Safety
- Plant Processes and Equipment
- Communication and Teamwork
- Piping and Heating Systems
- Instrumentation
- Industry-related Math and Science



Students must meet the following criteria:

- At least 18 years old
- Possess a high school diploma or GED
- Pass a basic math and reading comprehension assessment (To be scheduled)
- Have a valid CA driver's license

Spring into CS 2023

March 20-23 CCCOE was one of ten county offices of education participating, with Earn & Learn in Spring into CS week. Teachers and students from across Northern California participated in life virtual sessions with panels of industry experts in not only computer science, but other fields to talk about how computer science affects their industry.

Highlights included a demonstration of IBM's SkillsBuild program, representatives from Blue River Tech on how computer programs and AI are making agriculture more sustainable, BioCOM California on how CS is helping healthcare through genomic sequencing, Epic games on how games like Fortnite are created, and a drone scientist on the many uses of drones. The week ended with



a professional development session for teachers hosted by the industry representatives.

Over the course of the week an estimated 1200 teachers and students joined the sessions. Earn & Learn has also made recordings available for future use, and connections were made for future collaborations for sector events across counties.

CCC ROP Grant Highlights

CCC ROP receives CTEIG, K12 SWP and CAI Grants for sustaining and expanding programs

CCCOE CCC ROP program leads a consortium of districts to sustain, strengthen and expand Career pathways throughout the region. For almost 50 years, CCC ROP has worked with teachers, administrators and community partners to provide high quality CTE programs for students. The consortium has secured funding for the 2023-2024 school year to continue offering over 265 sections of ROP classes in 23 high schools through the CTE Incentive Grant (CTEIG) and the K12 Strong Workforce Program (K12 SWP). CCC ROP was awarded three grants from K12 SWP in the fifth round of funding. This follows on ten successful K12 SWP grants from rounds 1-4. This new funding will support 15 Local Educational Agencies including districts, charter schools and CCCOE's court and community schools.

The three grants will focus on the following programs:

- Equitable Access to CTE Pathways for Alternative Education Students
- Leveraging Economies of Scale to Provide Equitable Access to CTE Pathways and Work-based Learning
- Preparing the Next Gen Teachers: Starting teh Teacher Preparation Pipeline

These grants will fund new courses, teacher professional learning, and student experiences of the next two years. In addition to these grants, CCC ROP will be leading a **California Apprenticeship Initiative Grant** (CAI) in partnership with Contra Costa Community Colleges and the East Bay YMCA. Students in the apprenticeship program will earn college credit and experience on-the-job training to earn a Assistant Teacher certificate, propelling them forward in the education career pathway.

This work is all possible by partnerships with Districts and Sites, Community Colleges, Community and Business Partners, and the CCCOE team.

CCC ROP Introduces Precision Exams: Students Earn Industry Certification

Earning Industry Certifications is a measure of a High Quality CTE program. Standardized certificates showcase the knowledge that students have acquired in their CTE course. Recognized certification can lead to employment and additional post-secondary training. Increasing the number of students earning industry certifications is a goal of CCC ROP's programs.



CCC ROP is excited to announce access to Precision Exams through <u>You Science</u>. Precision Exams offer students entry- to mid-level certifications that act as tangible proof of their skills and knowledge. Proof that helps them enter the workforce or skip entry-level college courses, gain preferred hiring status, or earn a wage increase.

Teachers can choose from 200 exams in different Industry Clusters. Exams include 21st Century Success Skills, Engineering Principles, Biotechnology and more. Check out the <u>Certificate catalog here.</u>
