

California releases DRAFT of the State Plan for CTE

California Workforce Pathways Joint Advisory Committee (CWPJAC), in collaboration with the State Board of Education, the California Department of Education, and the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, invites you to participate in a public review of the **Draft California State Plan for Career and Technical Education**. This strategic plan and call to action sets forth a student-centered vision for the future of high-quality Career Technical Education (CTE) in the State of California.

Manufacturing Day 2023

CCCOE, in partnership with Earn and Learn, organized Manufacturing Day 2023 across Contra Costa County.

About 200 students participated in factory tours and other interactive experiences with local employers, then had lunch and a tour of engineering and manufacturing programs at one of the three colleges in the Contra Costa Community College District.





Company experiences included a visit to Contra Costa Transportation Authority's Gomentum Station and demonstration of Glydways' autonomous vehicle technology, Benchmark Electronics' Concord Precision Technology facility, Cemex Building Materials' Clayton Aggregates Quarry, Contra Costa Water District's Oakley plant, and a Brookfield Residential new home construction site in Brentwood.

Students finished the day by touring CTE facilities at the community college closest to their schools- Contra Costa, Diablo Valley and Los Medanos Colleges all welcomed students and showed their facilities and discussed their pathways.
