





Each team gives a presentation on stage in front of friends, family, and other competing teams. This project gives students a great opportunity to develop oral and written communication skills and learn a technical subject while exploring the boundaries of their creativity.


ROP Teacher Rebecca Quiñones Wins César Chávez Award
