

Golden Gate Community School Distance Learning Plan

The purpose of this document is to share with families and the community the policies, practices and plans of the Contra Costa County Office of Education (CCCOE) Student Programs Department during this time of school closure. These plans have been created with the unique needs of our students and families in mind.

The California Department of Education (CDE) has defined "distance learning" as "... instruction in which the student and instructor are in different locations. This may include interacting via the use of computer and communications technology, as well as delivering instruction and check-in time with their teacher. Distance learning may include video or audio instruction in which the primary mode of communication between the student and instructor is on-line interaction, instructional television, video, telecourses, or other instruction that relies on computer or communications technology. It may also include the use of print materials incorporating assignments that are the subject of written or oral feedback."

GOLDEN GATE COMMUNITY SCHOOL

GGCS will be delivering their curriculum via Oddyseyware/Edgenuity and Google Classroom, online learning platforms that have been in use this year.

- Math and Science: All students have been placed in an appropriate course for Math and Science in either Oddyseyware or Edgenuity based upon their grade level and course completion.
- **ELA:** Students will be reading a novel and accessing a course through Google Classroom. They will be responding to writing prompts and completing worksheets for vocabulary, ELD support and discussion prompts.
- Social Studies: Students will be given a course on Google Classroom created with support from U.C. Berkeley that focuses on immigration in California in the last 200 years.
- **PE:** Students will log their physical activity in a PE log.
- **Electives:** Students who are making adequate progress, will be allowed to add elective courses from the 100+ offerings in Oddyseyware/Edgenuity.

The state of California has received a waiver for state testing for the 2019-20 school year. Students will not be required to complete the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) or the English Language Proficiency Assessment for California (ELPAC) this year.

LESSON DELIVERY AND COMMUNICATION PLAN

All students have access to Odysseyware/Edgenuity and Google Classroom on a family device or one provided to them by the school. Odysseyware/Edgenuity and Google Classroom will be the delivery method for all curriculum for Golden Gate students while distance learning is enacted.

Teachers will make multiple weekly contacts with each student (at least 30 minutes in length) via phone, Google hangout or Teams. In these conferences, students and staff will be reviewing student work, providing feedback, and conducting assessment. Teachers will plan arrangements with families individually regarding the dates and times of these check-ins. Students who receive special education services will also be contacted by resource teachers and special education instructional assistants for extra support. The team will determine if additional supports or accommodations are needed.

Any students with questions regarding math class placement should contact their teacher. Any students struggling with this coursework should contact their teacher for additional support or alternate assignments.

Counseling and social work assistance as well as career and job readiness preparation will continue to be provided virtually.

Student work will not be graded in the traditional manner. Like all students in California, our students will receive earn credit in Quarter 4 on a pass/no mark scale and the grade will be pass/no mark.
