Vision

The vision of the Contra Costa County Board of Education is to provide leadership and advocacy for equitability of service and opportunities for all students and their families in a safe, supportive educational environment.

Mission

By keeping our focus on the best interest of students, the Board will be transparent in the exercise of its duties as statutorily defined* and as relates to the Board's responsibilities for charter schools and LCAP oversight for the programs operated by the County Superintendent of Schools.

Values

1. Safe and appropriate educational environments for students in all County Office of Education operated programs
2. Focus on the whole student socially, emotionally and academically
3. Valuing diversity and engaging our communities to acknowledge their respective origins
4. Open, honest communication and transparency
5. Focus on and value for collaboration and teamwork

Goals

1. Ensure accountability for student learning in schools and programs under the statutory authority of the County Board.
2. Support and advocate for equity and access to high-quality educational programs for ALL students, with a focus on English Learners (EL), low-performing students, and students with special needs.
3. Provide leadership in advocating at the local, state, and federal level for all learners through communicating public education's successes and challenges.
4. Promote greater community awareness of CCCOE programs and services and how they impact students, staff members and the community.
5. Serve as active stakeholders in the CCCOE Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) for Court and Community Schools.
6. Review, improve and implement effective protocols pertaining to its role as an appellate body (e.g. in the areas of Charter School Authorization and Oversight, Interdistrict Transfers, and Expulsion Appeals).
7. Deepen understanding of board leadership and effective governance and board capacity-building.



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*Statutory Roles- partial list

- Approves policies, regulations, and curriculum for the schools and educational programs operated by the County Office of Education
- Approves the annual budget of the County Office of Education and sets the County Superintendent of Schools' salary
- Receives an annual audit of the County Office of Education's budget
- Serves as an appeal board for the adjudication of [expulsion appeals](#), [interdistrict attendance appeals](#), and [charter schools](#)
- Advocates on behalf of education on the county, state, and national level
- Informs local communities about the programs and achievements of the County Office of Education
